The program has twenty-four churches and local organizations in its coalition; and, WHEREAS St. Matthew's facilitates meetings of the Boy and Girl Scout Troops of America, Home Study Music Program, Alcoholics Anonymous groups (AA and ALANON), and various Bible study groups, adding to their service of the community at large; and, WHEREAS St. Matthew's Episcopal Church has provided and will continue to provide a sanctuary, sense of community, and countless support systems for the residents of Universal City and the surrounding area; and, WHEREAS St. Matthew's Episcopal Church will celebrate their 60th anniversary on Sunday, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Universal City City Council joins St. Matthew's Episcopal Church, Rector Fr. Cristopher Robinson and the clergy, the vestry and parishioners in celebrating their 60th anniversary.
