Report From Clergy Conference

The annual gathering of diocesan clergy is always a delightful time. I get to spend a couple of days with some of my best friends; we spend some time talking about big-picture issues facing the church and our ministry together; and the clergy get to renew our ordination vows together. This year's speaker was Bishop Robert Wright from the Diocese of Atlanta, who talked to us about "preaching in challenging times." +Rob is a gifted speaker, and was a great encourager for all of us.

This year's clergy conference was followed by a preaching retreat with Dr. Eric Barreto from Princeton Theological Seminary, for which about 15 of us stayed.

Every year at clergy conference, our bishop gives some general instructions to the clergy of the diocese. Let me pass on a few notes:

The rebuilding efforts in Kerrville are underway, and it will be at least a three-year process. Episcopal Relief and Development is providing DWTX with a staff member for at least a year to help coordinate the efforts. Donations continue to come in from all around the country.

With the launch of the vocational deacon discernment track, there are more people involved in the vocations discernment process now than in the recent past, which is a happy thing. (If you want to explore a conversation about ordained ministry in the church, the first step is still to come talk to me.) Alex Holloway is the new dean of the Iona School for ministry education. There are six congregations in West Texas in a search process for new rectors/vicars.

The theme for Council 2026 in Corpus Christi will be "Let Your Love be Genuine" from Romans 12:9. There will be two sets of learning workshops again this year. Bishop Craig Loya of Minnesota will be the luncheon speaker.
